It's Spring !

As we know Whitley is not connected to the national mains gas network, despite us being right next to a major UK motorway. This means we all have to use alternative fuel sources, often far more expensive and less convenient than mains gas. There is however a possible answer, Fuel Syndicates. Fuel syndicates are groups of local people who negotiate an agreement with a single supplier with the purpose of achieving savings through making bulk orders. Many rural areas have formed syndicates and are achieving savings as big as 25%. Whitley is looking to do the same, we already have one group of 22 homes who are benefiting from a group contract for LPG, and we want to extend this and try and do the same for oil and include as many people as possible so we can all benefit from lower prices, (unfortunately if you are in contract with a supplier, you may have to wait until it expires). Mains Gas in Whitley

Over the years we have been asked many times why there is no mains gas in the village and can we mount a campaign to get it installed. Recent enquiries indicate that the cost will currently be in the region of £150,000, and this has all to be borne by participating Whitley residents. The logistics of being bounded by the M62 and canal to the north, and the distance south to Askern make the costs prohibitive. The large scale property developments here have never addressed this issue, nor have the developers been inclined to contribute anything to these infrastructure costs. If you feel enough Whitley residents would be willing to share these costs and want to pursue this, or start the campaign yourself, let us know!
