MAKING WHITLEY SAFER

Police Withdraw Camera Van from Whitley

Disappointingly, North Yorkshire Police recently decided to stop the regular patrols in the village claiming other priorities and the lack of accidents as the main reasons. In 2013 more than 250 drivers were stopped in our village, and issued with either penalty notices or required to attend a speed awareness course. This is as many or more than were stopped at other locations which oddly have retained regular patrols by the camera vans.

These figures demonstrate there is still a real problem with speeding along the A19 by a persistent group of motorists, and we want these patrols reinstated urgently.

OIL COOPERATIVE SAVES £2000 FOR LOCAL PEOPLE

DOG FOULING

The PC has been made aware of a problem with dog fouling along Learning Lane and in the Daffodil Park. This is unpleasant, potentially dangerous and, of course, an offence (£50 fine). Dog bins are sited at the entrance to the Daffodil Park so we do ask that dog owners use them.

PLAY AREAS

The PC is responsible for the maintenance of the three playgrounds in the village at the Daffodil Park, Lee View and Blackthorn Close. We have recently had our annual inspection check carried out by a specialist approved by ROSPA. All three were cleared of any serious defects, but there is some remedial work which the PC is now arranging to be completed. A copy of the full report is available from the PC.


The PC is also looking to improve these areas where possible, and welcomes your comments and suggestions. We are hoping to update the small area at the rear of Lee View to include a double toddler/parent swing after residents asked for this to be considered.

BUS SHELTER

We are also considering a proposal to fund a bus shelter for villagers travelling south from Whitley, as none of these stops currently provide any sheltering.
