CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT

I am happy to report that this past year, the Parish Council has successfully continued to carry out its duties and obligations on behalf of the community of Whitley. I hope you agree, but if not, we are always willing to listen to residents' concerns and suggestions.

We continue to communicate through the website and our Facebook pages, which we have found to be the most efficient and cost effective way of distributing local information.

You may have noticed on your Council Tax bill that the local precept (the tax portion that is received by the PC) was reduced this year. We took this decision because of a number of factors, but our primary aim is to provide the facilities for the village that are our responsibility whilst maintaining funds at a sensible level for the long term. This year we felt able to adjust this down, but we regularly review this and the figure could rise again as circumstances change over time. Our accounts and practices, under the supervision of our clerk, are strictly audited annually and we regularly receive a clean report that you can inspect on our website.

I'd like to thank Mr Jim Taylor, who was a prominent figure around the village as he cut our verges and kept the Daffodil Park and play areas in excellent condition for a number of years. Jim has now retired his post and we now welcome local firm, Bedford Mowing, who have taken on the contract. They have a lot of experience in this area including substantial projects at Gale Common.

We did not find a way to create an open community event this year such as the Queen's 90th Birthday Party of 2016 but plans are afoot... if you do wish to get involved in the village, we are championing the Friends of Whitley as a social, community based group looking to improve some of the natural green areas around Whitley. My thanks, again, to my excellent fellow councillors, our diligent parish clerk, and everyone who contributes to this community.
