DAFFODII PARK AND PLAY ARFAS

A19 SPEEDING & VEHICLE ACTIVATED SIGN

We have upgraded the new sign which we bought last year. It can now record vehicle volumes and speeds. We have started to post some of the reports on local social media and our website. We intend to use the information to lobby the police for more patrols. The sign can be moved between Lee View and All Saints on the A19, and Gravel Hill Lane. GALE COMMON ASH EXTRACTION PROJECT

You should be well aware that NYCC approved the planning application relating to the long term extraction of ash, known as PFA, from the Gale Common site last November. We argued strongly against this proposal. The parish councils of Cridling Stubbs, Womersley and Heck have joined with us to explore the legal possibility of challenging this decision by judicial review.

This is not a decision that has been taken lightly, and will incur considerable cost should we fail, but the long term impacts of this will be felt in our communities for many years.
