

## **Your Precept**

This is the part of your council tax that the Parish Council receives in order to function, currently set at £13,000 in total for the year (approx. £32 per Band D household). Here in Whitley, the bulk of this money pays for regular verge cutting on the A19, and maintenance of the Daffodil Park near Whitley Farm Close, as well as the two other play areas at Lee View & Blackthorn Close, to the south of the village. We also employ a part time clerk, and have a number of other statutory costs to meet. All our expenditure is set out in our published information on our website.

#### **Nature Reserve**

On Gravel Hill Lane past the mushroom farm is our nature reserve, formerly known as Whitley Common. This has been rather neglected over recent years, but our neighbours Monaghan Mushrooms have now helped with us to improve the area, restoring access to paths, and providing and installing new seating. They also organise regular litter picks along Gravel Hill. We are very grateful to Dave, Phil and their team for the work they are putting in at no cost to the Council.

We are all aware of the additional traffic through the village caused by the continued works to the A1 flyover at Wentbridge. This work is scheduled to finally be completed this summer.

Nonetheless we remain in contact with the owners Eggborough Power, who tell us no extraction will take place until at least 2027 due to world events & global markets.

Disappointingly we have just heard that the pub has closed. The Parish Council will try to find out what the next steps might be.



The new local plan for North Yorkshire has started with a process known as the call for sites. This stage is an opportunity for land owners, site promoters, developers or other interested parties to put sites forward for consideration in the new local plan to meet the future needs of the area.

A comprehensive consultation will take place later in the process that will seek the views of the community on all sites, after work has been completed to give a greater direction as to whether sites are likely to be either recommended for allocation or dismissed.

The Parish Council is made aware of all planning applications in our area and we have the opportunity to submit comments, for or against. There have to be good reasons to object, we can't just say "we don't like it".

Currently the developer Harron Homes have told us they are considering building about 80 homes on the field next to

Church Row. No formal application has been submitted and we have invited them to come and talk to us about their plans.
