A19 SPEEDING

We have taken the decision to purchase a new mobile Vehicle Activated Sign for the village, to augment the two fixed VAS already in place. THE PARISH COUNCIL continues to carry out its duties and obligations on behalf of the community of Whitley. I hope you agree, but if not, we are always willing to listen to residents' concerns and suggestions.

The parish council, like everyone, has had to adjust to these unprecedented circumstances, but has found ways to communicate and function. Our meetings are being held by video conference and our contractors are maintaining the verges and park areas as normal. There are obviously things that can't happen right now, but we can all look forward to the village returning to a sense of normality and community in the near future.

In this last year, we have welcomed new councillors, **Dave Broadbent** and **Tim Woodhead**. Dave has lived here for seventeen years and takes a keen interest in community activities. He is currently helping to coordinate the national Covid-19 response within NHS management. Tim moved to Whitley more recently, but has quickly engaged with the council and, when not cheering on Leeds United, steers the Gale Common Action Group, addressing this huge planning application which is of great concern to us all here.

Like all local parishes, we have looked to make sure our vulnerable residents have remained safe and well. It is a time honoured tradition here that the parish council delivers a Christmas hamper to each of our senior residents. This 'Over 80s' group has given us a loose database to work with. I am very pleased that we have not been made aware of anyone in this group missing help or needing assistance during this awful period. And a big thanks to Cllr Kath Walton who organises and delivers the hampers every year, and has taken the trouble to contact everyone on the list recently to make sure all is well.
