Neighbourhood police report

Fortunately we have low crime levels in Whitley. However, the neighbourhood policing team has noticed a recent increase in the theft of scrap metal. So make sure you keep any valuable metal items out of sight. Secondly, the police are having a blitz on illegal parking on the pavement. Eco-town latest

Fingers crossed! The 11 Councils which make up Leeds City Region have decided not to recommend any sites at all for an eco-town in this area. But it's not over yet – The Department for Communities and Local Government will make a final decision in August.

<u> Traffic – green light!</u>



All residents should have received a consultation guestionnaire from North Yorkshire County Council seeking views on new traffic schemes. They include traffic calming repeater lights in the village and at Balne crossroads, a zebra crossing in the centre of the village, a footpath extension, and a marked cycle route. This is all great news. Don't forget to respond to the consultation - say YES!

Whitley gears up for the Olympics! Good progress is being made on plans to develop a sports and recreation area in the centre of the village, opposite the pub. Landscape architects have drawn up plans which include a junior sports pitch, log play areas, grassy open space, and landscaped boggy areas. We now need formal permission to change the use of the land from agricultural to recreational. We are setting up a committee of residents to take this forward.Please contact Kath Walton on 662720 if you want to be involved. Meanwhile the refurbished school field is being well used by the school, Whitley Wolves, and the community more widely.

Whitley Lodge latest

Despite strong objections from the Parish and District Councillors, the application by McInerney homes to build 62 homes on the Tunstall site have been approved by Selby District Council. Following objections, the original plans have been modified to reduce the number of homes by a third, keep more mature trees, improve access to the site, and provide a play area.

Dog poo

The Parish Council is getting complaints about dog poo in Lea Lane, past the playground. This is a major health hazard. Please be a responsible resident and clean up after your dog. Keep our community clean and healthy.

Community Hall

Plans to convert part of the church into a community hall are still in the pipeline although we have had to seek alternative sources of funding.
